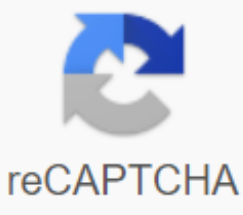

The idea behind this pattern is to separate your different concerns to facilitate the testing and management of your website. Historically, when developers worked with Umbraco, they broke this paradigm. If you pass IPublishedContent and tie the properties in the view, the HTML is actually confused in your code. A better approach is to pass a strongly typed model to the view. All the code and logic required to retrieve the data needed to display the page's data on the page must be done at the controller level (or at least at the model level). Avoid logic in the view. It is possible to do this, but it actually breaks the MVC pattern. One of the reasons MVC has been adopted is to keep your website easy. Historically, most Umbraco projects I've worked on have been involved in providing some templates with a pre-fixed layout. The document types that power these templates allow the Content Editor to update content, but give them limited permissions to change the layout compared to other CMS systems like Episerver and Sitecore. In Umbraco 7.2, a new GridView property was introduced. The GridView property gives the content editor more power in how the page is created. The Content Editor now has permission to create components, such as banners and action block calls, in the area specified in the template. This feature means that you can decide how the layout of the page will look in Umbraco without requiring a developer. If this is something of your contentwould love, and this section is for you.
